

# Reptile Rally

## Pre-Program Activity

### Grades 6-8



**Objective:** Students will compare mythical creatures to real reptiles.

#### Sunshine State Standards:

**Overview:** Students make a poster that shows a mythical creature and a real reptile.

#### Materials:

- [List of mythical creatures and poster guide](#)
- Internet and/or library access
- Large sheets of paper or posterboard
- Pencils, crayons or markers

#### Procedure:

- Ask students to name some legendary/mythological creatures. Point out that many of these creatures have features that are similar to real animals.
- Explain to the class that they are going to be examining some mythical creatures that resemble reptiles. Put students into small groups and assign each group one of the creatures.
- Give each group a large sheet of paper and have them divide it into four boxes.
- Allow students time to research their creature and fill in the boxes on their poster according to the poster guide.
- Have each group share their poster with the rest of the class.
